## THANK YOU FOR KEEPING THE METER BOX CLEAR!

All buildings in Coupeville served by our water system are connected to the Town's water lines through a meter box. The meter box is typically located on the front of the property, near the roadway. There is an emergency shut off valve in the box, as well as the meter which we read every two months to determine water consumption for billing purposes.

You can help us by keeping the meter box clear. Please do not cover it with landscaping, dirt or beauty bark, or piles of yard debris.
