

An ordinance annexing unincorporated area  
to Town of Coupeville.

Be it Ordained, by the Town Council of  
Coupeville, Washington:

Effective on the 1st day of January, 1955,  
the following described unincorporated areas  
contiguous to the town of Coupeville is hereby  
annexed to the town of Coupeville, pursuant  
to the signing and filing of a petition for  
annexation, the setting of a date for a public  
hearing thereon, the publication and posting  
of a notice of such hearing, the holding  
of a public hearing thereon, and full  
conformance with the laws of the State of  
Washington pertaining to annexation by  
the petition method.

#### Description

Beginning at a point that is 606.50  
feet east of the northeast corner of Block 26  
of the plat of Coupeville as per records of  
Island County, Washington; thence south 1713.62  
feet; thence South  $89^{\circ} 33' 30''$  east 726.25 feet;  
thence north along the east boundary of the  
J.L. Coupe D.C. to the north boundary of the  
southeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 34,  
Township 32 N., Range 1 E. W.M. west to the  
point of beginning; also, the northeast quarter  
of the southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of said Section 34, Township  
32 N., Range 1 E. W.M.
