

Ordinance #14

An Ordinance defining "Transient Merchant," providing a license for such transient merchants, and providing a penalty for transacting business in the town of Couperville, Washington, without first having obtained a license as herein provided.

Be it ordained by the council of the town of Couperville, Washington;

1. That a Transient Merchant shall be defined and construed to be one who sells or offers for sale goods, wares, or merchandise in the town of Couperville, Washington, and who does not intend to and who does not remain in said town for a period of longer than 60 days.

2. All transient merchants shall pay a license fee of \$10.00 per day for each and every day they transact business in said town of Couperville to the town clerk, before selling or offering for sale any goods, wares or merchandise.

3. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall pay a fine of not to exceed \$25.00 or be imprisoned in the town jail for not to exceed 10 days.

4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval and publication according to law.
