

Ordinance No. 15.

An ordinance to prohibit any person or persons from placing wood, lumber, earth, stone or gravel or any other obstruction on the roads, streets or sidewalks of Couperville, Washington, unless written permission is first obtained from the street and sidewalk committee, and providing a penalty for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the council of the town of Couperville, Washington;

1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to place wood, lumber, earth, stone, or gravel, and any obstruction on the roads, streets or sidewalks of Couperville, Washington, unless written permission is first obtained from the street and sidewalk committee of the town council.

2. Any person violating the provisions of the ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$10.00 or be imprisoned in the town jail not to exceed (5) five days.

3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval and publication according to law.
