

Ordinance 21020

An Ordinance defining certain nuisances prohibiting them in the Town of Couperville, and providing a penalty for the violation of this ordinance.

Be it ordained by the council of the town of Couperville, Washington;

1. Permitting any dead carcass of any animal or the offal from any dead animal to remain exposed on his property or the street or streets abutting thereon by any property owner or the tenant in possession shall be deemed a nuisance, and any person or persons knowingly permitting the same shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$5.00 or be imprisoned in the town jail not to exceed 10 days.

2. It shall be a nuisance for any person or persons to throw slops into the public streets of Couperville, Washington, or to drain any sink or cess pool or sewerage of any kind into the streets of said town, and any person violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not to exceed \$10.00, or be imprisoned in the town jail not to exceed 5 days.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval and publication according to law.
