

Ordinance #22.

An ordinance levying the general taxes for the town of Couperville, Washington, for the fiscal year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1911, on all the taxable property, both real and personal, in said town, subject to taxation therein, for the purpose of raising revenue to carry on the different departments of said town for the ensuing fiscal year, prescribing and apportioning the same among the different funds of said town, for said fiscal year, and providing for the collection thereof.

Whereas, on the 23rd day of August, 1910, the town council of said town did duly and regularly adopt an estimate of the amount of money required to meet the public expenses of said town for the ensuing year and the amount to be raised by taxation in said town for the ensuing year, and the estimated amount of the receipts for the ensuing year from sources other than direct taxation, and,

Whereas, said estimate together with the notice that said town council would meet on the first Monday of October, 1910, at the court house in said town, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M., of said day, for the purpose of hearing objections or approval of said estimate, was published for two consecutive weeks in the Island County Times, the official newspaper of said town as required by law, and,

Whereas, said time for considering said estimates and tax levies has now arrived, and said town council having heard all taxpayers appearing in favor of or against said proposed tax levies, do hereby make, determine and decide that the amount of taxes to be levied upon current assessment rolls to be the sum of \$825.⁰⁰/₁₀₀ Dollars apportioned as hereinafter described.

Now, therefore, Be it ordained by the council of the town of Couperville Washington:

1. That there be and is hereby levied

upon the taxable real and personal property in the town of Couperville, Washington, subject to taxation therein, a general property tax for municipal purposes for the ensuing fiscal year, commencing January 1st, 1911 of Eight Hundred and Twenty Five $\$825.00$ Dollars.

2. Said tax shall be apportioned to the various funds of said year as follows:

1. Park fund, $\$80.00$
2. Current expense fund, 445.50
3. Road and Street fund, 300.00

3. That the town clerk be, and he hereby is directed to certify to the county auditor, the ^{county} assessor and county treasurer a copy of this ordinance in compliance with law, and in order that the same may be extended upon the general assessment roll of said county in the same manner and at the same time that the levy for state and county purposes is extended.

4. That said tax shall be collected and paid into the county treasury at the time and in the manner provided by the laws of the state of Washington, relating to collections of taxes in cities of the third and fourth classes.

5. The ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its approval and publication according to law.
