

ORDINANCE No. 32.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING AND REGULATING THE TYING OF ANIMALS TO FENCES AND IN THE STREETS OF THE TOWN OF COUPEVILLE, WASHINGTON, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the Town of Coupeville, Washington:

Sec.1; That it shall be unlawful for any person to tie any horse, mare, gelding, stallion, ass, mule, cow, steer, bull, calf, heifer, sheep, goat or pig swine to any fence, in the Town of Coupeville, not his own, without having first obtained, from the owner of such fence, permission so to do.

Sec.2; That it shall be unlawful for any person to tie any animal in such a manner that the rope, cord, chain or other means wherewith such animal is tied, fastened or secured crosses or can cross any sidewalk, or the traveled portion of any road, ~~XXXX~~ street, alley or avenue, in the Town of Coupeville.

Sec.3; That it shall be unlawful for any person to tie, picket, fasten or stake any animal in such a manner that such animal can walk on or step on any sidewalk, or touch any ornamental or artificially planted tree, bush or shrub on any lot, block, park, park-strip, road, street, alley or avenue, in the Town of Coupeville.

Sec.4; That the Town Marshall of said Town of Coupeville shall have the power and it shall be his duty to take up and impound any and all animals tied, fastened, picketed, staked or secured in violation of this ordinance.

Sec.5; That any and all animals taken up and impounded under the provisions of this Ordinance shall, in every respect, be treated as stock running at large, and the same fees shall be charged, collected, received, paid and accounted for in the amounts and in the manner as is now provided by Ordinance No.24 for stock running at large.

Sec.6; This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
