

ORDINANCE NO. 62

An Ordinance fixing and establishing the salaries to be paid to and bonds to be furnished by certain officers and employees of the Town of Coupeville, Washington

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCILL OF THE TOWN OF COUPEVILLE, WASHINGTON, as follows:-

Section 1. That the salaries paid to the Towh Clerk and to the Town Treasurer, from and after the second Tuesday in January, 1940, shall be, to the Town Cler, Ten dollars per month and to the Town Treasurer, fifteen dollars per month; which amounts shall be paid during any one calendar year from such appropriate fund or funds as shall be determined by the Town Council and provided in the annual budget for that year.

Section 2. That the Town Clerk shall, upon assuming the said office after lawful election or appointment, execute and deliver to the Town of Coupeville, Washington, a surety bond in lthe sum of five hundred dollars, conditioned on the faithful performance of his duties as such Town Clerk as prescribed by the laws of the State of Washington; provided, that the premium or cost of said bond shall be paid by the Town.

Section 3. That the salaries paid to the Water Superintendent, to the Librarian, to the Town Marshal, and to other employees of the Town whose duties are in whole or in part fixed or stated by Ordinance, shall during any one calendar year be paid in such amounts and from such funds as may have been provided in the annual budget for that year; provided, that the Council may increase such aalaries by Council by lawful resolution in case the duties of the position are increased or made more onerous during the year.

Section 4. That Ordinances No. 1,12,30, and 38 of the
Town Of Coupeville, being inconsistent with this ordinance,
are hereby repealed.
