

ORDINANCE No. 63.

An ordinance pertaining to annual municipal elections and to caucuses.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF COUPEVILLE, WASHINGTON

1. That the annual general election for the Town of Coupeville shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in December of each year, and said election shall be open to voters from eight o'clock in the morning until eight o'clock in the evening on the said date.

2. Said election shall be held at the Public Library. The Board of Election shall consist of one inspector and two judges, who shall be appointed by the Town Council at its first regular meeting in November of each year.

3. Notice of said election shall be given at least twenty days preceding such election; shall be signed by the town clerk; shall designate the place, the time, the offices to be filled, and the proposition (if any) to be voted on; and shall be published once in the official newspaper and posted on the door of the polling place.

4. Candidates for office shall be nominated at a caucus to be held in the Public Library each year at a time to be set by the Town Council and to be published in the same manner as the notice of election; provided, that the caucus shall precede the election by not more than twenty nor less than ten days.

5. This ordinance supersedes Ordinance No. 23, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval and publication according to law.
