

ORDINANCE NO. 64

An Ordinance Relating to the Sewer and Waterworks systems of the Town of Coupeville, and Providing for Their Union as One System Subject to Approval by a Vote of the People.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF COUPEVILLE, WASHINGTON

Section 1: That Ordinance No 57, relating to voluntary and compulsory connections with the sewers, be amended to substitute the words "Water Superintendent" for the words "Street Commissioners" wherever they occur, together with such substitutions of singular for plural forms of pronouns and verbs as are thereby made necessary.

Section 2.: That the Council may, by lawful resolution, exempt the park, municipally owned buildings and grounds, the streets, or any of them from payment of water or sewer rentals or charges.

Section 3: That the Town's system of sewerage shall be operated as a part of and belonging to its waterworks utility; provided that the proposition authorizing such operation shall be submitted to the voters of the Town at the next general municipal election, and, if a majority of the voters voting at such election shall vote in favor of such proposition, then the same shall be deemed to have carried.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall be published once in the Island County Times, a weekly newspaper published and of general circulation in the Town of Coupeville, which newspaper is hereby designated as the official newspaper of the said Town.

Section 5. That such part of this ordinance as is subject to a vote of the people shall become effective ten days after the general municipal election if the proposition shall have carried, or

shall be of no effect if the proposition shall not have carried;
and that the remaining parts of this ordinance shall take effect
and be in force from and after its approval and publication
according to law.
