

ORDINANCE No. 65

An Ordinance Regulating the Construction of Sidewalks Within the Town of Coupeville, Washington; and correcting the numbering of Ordinance No. 64.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF COUPEVILLE, WASHINGTON:

SECTION 1. That all sidewalks hereafter built in the Town of Coupeville, Washington, upon Front Street between First East Street and Alexander Street, or upon Main Street, shall be constructed of concrete, in accordance with plans and specifications to be prescribed by the Council and placed on file with the Town Clerk.

SECTION 2. That all sidewalks hereafter built upon any other street of the said Town of Coupeville shall consist of material having a hard surface impervious to water; provided, that whenever a sidewalk shall be constructed of concrete, in accordance with plans and specifications acceptable to Council, the Town will assume and pay one half the necessary cost of construction, the owner of abutting property paying one half the cost in this case and the full cost in any other case.

SECTION 3. That all sidewalks shall be installed to be of such width and to conform to such grade as the Council may establish; and before any sidewalk is constructed the proposed builder thereof, or the owner of the abutting property, shall procure from the Town Clerk the grade line and written license for such construction.

Section 4. Proper barriers and danger signals shall be provided by the builder, to keep all traffic off the sidewalk during

construction, and he shall be liable for all damages occurring because of any failure to provide same.

SECTION 5. Ordinance No. 18 of the Town of Coupeville, being inconsistent herewith is hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. The ordinance which passed October 14, 1941, and which was erroneously published as Ordinance No. 62, is hereby amended as to its serial number only, and shall be and appear as Ordinance No. 64.
