An ordinance defining the term "peddler" providing for licensing peddlers, and providing a penalty for peddling without a license.

Be it ordained by the council of the town of Coupeville, Washington:

Sec. 1. The term peddler shall be construed to include all persons who go from place to place or house to house, carrying for sale, offering for sale, or exposing for sale any goods, wares or merchandise, except agricultural or farm product.

Sec. 2. Every peddler, before selling, offering or exposing for sale, any goods, wares or merchandise, excepting agricultural or farm product, in the town of Coupeville, Washington, shall apply to the town marshal and obtain a license, and shall pay for same a license fee as follows:

Peddler on foot	\$5.00	pr. Day
Peddler with wagon	\$10.00	pr. Day
Peddler with any other conveyance	\$10.00	pr. Day

Sec. 3. Every peddler who shall sell, offer or expose for sale any goods, wares, merchandise, other than agricultural or farm product, in the town of Coupeville, Washington, without first having obtained a license as herein provided, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in ~~any~~ sum not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisoned in the town jail not to exceed 10 Days.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication according to law in the Island County Times
