

Ordinance no. 9,

An ordinance to prohibit Loud, Scissious, profane, language, indecent and vulgar language, drunkenness and boisterous conduct, and fixing a penalty for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the council of the town of Coupeville, Washington;

Sec. 1. That anyone who shall use, in the presence of any person, loud, boisterous, profane language, or indecent or vulgar language, or who shall appear on the Streets or alleys, or in any public place or conveyance in Coupeville, Washington, in an indecent, drunken or maudlin condition shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$4000, or be imprisoned in the town jail not to exceed 60 Days, or both and cost.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication according to law in the Island County Times.

he shall forthwith notify the town clerk of said town of Coupeville of the total assessed valuation of the property situated in said town of Coupeville, as equalized by said late board, and the town council of said town of Coupeville, shall forthwith proceed to fix and determine their levy for municipal purposes for such year, which levy shall immediately be certified to the county auditor of said Island County, under the hand and seal of the town clerk of Coupeville, Washington. The county auditor shall thereupon extend said taxes upon the property shown by such assessment roll to be within said town of Coupeville, as fixed by such levy, at the same time and in the same manner as he extends the general county and state taxes, and deliver said roll to county treasurer.

6. The county treasurer upon the receipt of such roll, shall proceed to collect and receipt for the taxes for said town of Coupeville thereon extended at the same time and in the same manner as he proceeds in the collections of the other taxes on such roll.

7. The county treasurer shall make a certified report at the end of each month to the treasurer of Coupeville, Washington, of the amount collected by him on account of such taxes from the time he shall commence the collection thereof until the whole tax collected shall be paid over to such town treasurer.

8. All municipal taxes when so levied by the town of Coupeville, Washington, either upon personal or real property, shall become due and collectible, and shall be declared delinquent at the same time.

and in the same manner as state and county taxes.

4. All delinquent taxes of the town of Couperville, Washington, shall be subject to the same penalty and be collected in the same manner, and in the same action by the same officers, as the state and county taxes levied against the said property.

10. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication.
