

ORDINANCE NO. 92.

An Ordinance Fixing and Establishing the Salaries to be Paid To and Bonds to Be Furnished by Certain Officers of the Town of Coupeville.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Town of Coupeville, Washington, as follows:

Section 1. That the salaries paid to the Town Clerk, the Town Treasurer, and the Police Justice, from and after the expiration of the present terms of the said officers in June, 1952, shall be as follows: To the Town Clerk, Twenty Dollars (\$20.) per month; to the Town Treasurer, Twenty Dollars (\$20.) per month; and to the Police Justice, Ten Dollars (\$10.) per month.

Section 2. That the Town Clerk, the Town Treasurer, and the Police Justice shall severally, upon assuming the said offices after lawful election or appointment, execute and deliver to the Town of Coupeville, surety bonds in the sums of five Hundred Dollars, (\$500.) Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) and Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.) respectively, conditioned on the faithful performance of their several official duties as prescribed by the laws of the State of Washington; provided that the official duties of the Treasurer are deemed to include all collecting, accounting and disbursing done for the Town and its agencies; and provided further, that the premium or cost of said bond shall be paid by the Town.

Section 3. That Ordinance No. 6, No. 54, No. 62 (except Section 3 which is retained in force) and No. 74 of the Town of Coupeville, being inconsistent with this ordinance, are hereby repealed, effective June 2, 1952.
