CENTRAL WHIDBEY FIRE & RESCUE HYDRANT TESTING
Oct 15-19 • 8 am - 4:30 pm

The purpose of water main flushing is to remove iron and manganese sediment that can settle in the lines. During the flushing and hydrant testing, the water in the mains may become turbid (dirty looking). The turbid water is not hazardous to health, but may cause staining in your laundry. We suggest you refrain from doing laundry during the flushing hours. Sometimes tap water may be dirty looking, run your faucet for a few seconds to clear the line.

Individual, prior notice of daily flushing activities will not be given.
