DOG LICENSE RENEWALS

Dog licenses expire on December 31st. Residents of Coupeville are required to license dogs over six months of age. The owner must provide proof of current rabies vaccination. Keep your dog's license information current so we are able to contact you if your pet gets lost or injured. Licenses are available at Town Hall.

- \$5 for neutered or spayed dogs
- \$25 for all other dogs
- No charge for service dogs
