- Signal mirror, whistle, multi-function tool, rope, tarp, duct tape, lighter
- Survival blanket, extra socks, work gloves, warm gloves, hand warmers
- Basic first aid supplies, prescriptions
- Copy of your ID, emergency contact info, pad and pencil
