**CALL TO ORDER**

At 6:00pm, Mayor Hughes called the meeting to order and led the Council in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

**PRESENT**

Mayor Molly Hughes, Councilmembers Jenny Bright, Rick Walti, Kristo Allred, Evan Henrich, and Jackie Henderson

**STAFF PRESENT**

Clerk-Treasurer Corine Jackson, Deputy Clerk Chris Jolly, Community Planning Director Josh Pitts, and Assistant Planner Lisa Walsh

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

The agenda of the June 9, 2026 Regular Council Meeting was approved as submitted.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

The Minutes of the May 26, 2026 Regular Council Meeting were approved as submitted.

**MAYOR'S REPORT**

- Mayor Hughes reported that the IRTPO funding the Town received is actually Federal money, not State money, which causes a lot of problems for the Town and reduces the amount of time the Town would have to spend the money. The Town will continue with the \$50,000 WSDOT evaluation for the turn lane from N. Main to SR 20, but will give back the remainder of the funds.
- Mayor Hughes reported that Town staff had a Wellness event at the end of May, where prizes were given out for the latest Wellness challenge. The staff contributed to a potluck taco bar, and everyone had a good time.
- Mayor Hughes reported that the Town is still looking for volunteers for the Trust Board and a Parks and Rec Committee.
- Mayor Hughes reported that herself, Assistant Planner Walsh, and Councilmembers Bright and Walti attended the grand opening of the new affordable housing units in Langley, built by Island Roots. The complex includes 14 units - two and three bedroom apartments.
- Mayor Hughes reminded Council and the public that the Pride parade is June 13, the Six-Year TIP Council Workshop on June 15, the final Comprehensive Plan Open House is June 16, and June 19<sup>th</sup> is a Federal Holiday and Town Hall staff will be off that day.

**PRESENTATION**

Executive Director of Sno-Isle Libraries, Eric Howard, and Coupeville Library Manager, Emily Felt, presented to Council on the library system's long range planning. Felt also provided annual statistics for the Coupeville Library and talked about summer programming.

**AUDIENCE INPUT**

- Mark Levensky addressed the Council asking that they rescind their January vote on Right-of-Way reductions and that the NW Third Street extension to NW Broadway be removed from the Six-Year Transportation Improvement Plan.
- Cecilia Bartram addressed the Council with concerns about tree removal along the NW Third St. corridor. Bartram asked about enforcement of tree coverage conditions and asks the Town to remedy the situation and protect the remaining forest in subarea F of the MOA.
- Linda Wandro addressed the Council to thank the Town for mowing around the stormwater retention pond in the Krueger Farms neighborhood.
- Mark Sheehan addressed the Council concerned about the Town mowing around the stormwater retention pond because the area is still privately owned. Asked if the Town would come mow in front of his house.
- Ricardo Reyes addressed the Council about the confusion over whether the stormwater retention pond is the Peaceful Valley HOA's responsibility or the Town's.

**NEW BUSINESS****Planeteria Media Contract**

Action: A motion was made by Councilmember Henderson, seconded by Councilmember Bright, to authorize the Mayor to sign a Professional Services Agreement with Planeteria Media for Website Redesign services not to exceed \$28,750, and an ongoing security and maintenance agreement. The motion passed unanimously.

**CUP-26-001**

Action: A motion was made by Councilmember Walti, seconded by Councilmember Henderson, to approve Conditional Use Permit Application CUP-26-001. The motion passed unanimously.

**Agreement with Coupeville Festival Association for improvements to the Johnson Lot**

*The agreement was amended to remove Article 6 about prevailing wages.*

Action: A motion was made by Councilmember Henderson, seconded by Councilmember Bright, to authorize the Mayor to sign an agreement with the Coupeville Festival Association for improvements to the Johnson Lot as amended. The motion passed unanimously.

**May 2026 Payroll and A/P Transactions**

Action: A motion was made by Councilmember Allred, seconded by Councilmember Walti, to approve May 2026 Payroll EFT Transactions for a total of \$149,807.56, and May 2026 A/P Transactions and EFT payments #11788 - #11835 for a total of \$239,705.45. The motion passed unanimously.

## **COUNCIL REPORTS**

### **Councilmember Henrich**

Councilmember Henrich reported that Island County is conducting 100 days of technical feasibility studies for the jail site options. We likely won't hear anything else about the new jail until later this year with the feasibility studies are complete.

### **Councilmember Bright**

Councilmember Bright reported that Island Transit Board met on June 5<sup>th</sup>. Bright encouraged the public to double check the online bus schedules with more tourists coming to the island.

## **DISCUSSION**

### **Comprehensive Plan Periodic Update and Development Regulations**

Community Planning Director Pitts led a discussion with the Council regarding the work that has been done over the last six months to incorporate the comments from the Department of Commerce. Councilmembers asked questions about planning for green space equitability, neighborhood retail, and whether the Town has a stand alone Long Range Plan that is separate from the Comprehensive Plan.

## **AUDIENCE INPUT**

- Pat Morse addressed the Council requesting corrections to the dwelling credit transfers in the MOA area. Morse provided the Council with a signed objection letter, which was also submitted to the Planning Commission on June 2, 2026
- Ricardo Reyes addressed the Council to report that the boat launch needs repairs, and to task about when the video from the Jun 2, 2026 Planning Commission meeting would be available on the website.
- Debra Stroh addressed the Council about a pattern of decisions made by staff and Councilmembers regarding the MOA since it's inception. Stroh mentioned forest being cleared where it should have been protected, infrastructure sized for density, and transferred dwelling unit credits. Stroh asks the Town to collaborate with the community to find a constructive solution.
- Michelle Connor addressed the Council regarding concerns over the administration of the MOA and the transfer of dwelling unit credits. Connor encouraged the Council to review the dwelling credit chart she made, to be more transparent, and to work with the community to find a solution.
- Susan Asplin addressed the Council to raise concerns over parcels in subarea B of the MOA that are currently not developed. Asplin's concern is that the Town has not applied dwelling unit credits to specific parcels, but leaves them generally assigned to each subarea, which could mean that one of those owners could be left with an unbuildable parcel if the dwelling unit credits are used up by other developers. Asplin asks that the Town specifically assign a dwelling unit credit to each of the undeveloped parcels so those owners could develop the land in their own time.
- Mark Sheehan addressed the Council to inform them and staff that the resident directly adjacent to the NW Third Street Right-of-Way is using that Right-of-Way as access onto

private property, and is damaging the ground and illegally using Town-owned property for private purposes.

- Susan Upchurch addressed the Council concerned that there was not more discussion of the MOA during the Comprehensive Plan and Development Regulations presentation by Community Planning Director Pitts.

RE: 2027 Six-year Transportation Improvement Plan

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Council,

By State law, the Town must adopt a six-year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) each year. This year's list includes three new projects from Public Works; 4<sup>th</sup> Street pedestrian path, safety improvements at the intersection of Hwy 20 and Broadway and town wide crack seal work. The council added a pedestrian path on NE 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and separated the NW 3<sup>rd</sup> street extension into two projects; the street extension and pedestrian path. We have changed the priority of many projects.

It is important to put every project we can think of on the list in case a grant opportunity presents itself. The top ten priorities are pretty well set, after that priorities can change for a number of reasons; new projects, grant availability, other projects fall behind or move up, etc. While we are required to prioritize this list, it is a flexible document.

Some of the items on the list may coincide with upcoming utility projects. Every effort will be made to coordinate projects to minimize cost to the Town and impact on the community. Some projects are grant dependent. Some projects require coordination with partners like WSDOT or Island Transit.

The attached TIP should include all the changes and priorities we discussed at the Council workshop on June 15.

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council is granted the authority, following a public hearing, to adopt a revised and extended TIP each year; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council held a public hearing on June 23, 2026 after due and proper notice and approved the TIP for the years 2027 through 2032;

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the Town of Coupeville, Island County Washington;

**Section 1.** The Town Council hereby adopts a six-year Transportation Improvement Program for the years 2027 through 2032, attached to this Resolution incorporated by this reference.

**Section 2.** Filing of Plan, Pursuant to Chapter 35.77 RCW, within 30 days of the adoption of the Resolution, the Deputy Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to file a copy of this Resolution, together with Attachment A (project descriptions and expenditures projections) attached hereto, with the Secretary of Transportation.
